

Sports Premium Funding 2013/2014

BACKGROUND

Since the Olympics and Paralympics in 2012, the Government is aiming to create a lasting legacy of achievement at participation in sports.

In order to achieve this and improve the provision of both Physical Education and sport in primary schools, the Government have provided schools with additional funding of $\pounds150$ million per annum for the academic years 2013/4 and 2014/5

All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil.

At <u>St Finbars Catholic Primary School</u> we will receive <u>£8630</u> for the <u>2013/4</u> academic year.

PURPOSE OF FUNDING

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

ACCOUNTABILITY

From September 2013, schools will be held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding.

Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision. One year on, Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year's expenditure of additional funding and its impact.

Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents

Swimming

Every children from Y2 – 6 receives a 10 week block of swimming lessons. This is organised by Liverpool Schools Swimming Team. Our weekly sessions are held at Park Road Pool

Our Aim is that all children leave our school at the end of Year 6 being able to swim 25m.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURE ACTIVITIES

In order to promote enjoyment in Physical Education, this year our pupils will be embarking on an adventure trip to the Kinglswood Centre at Colomendy.

The children undertake a variety of activities which generally include: climbing, abseiling, giant swing, map reading, zip wire and problem solving activities.

Year 6 children look upon this trip as a highlight of their time at St. Finbars
