The Solemnity of Mary acknowledges and celebrates Mary's role as the mother of Jesus Christ. The Roman Catholic Church considers it a holy day of obligation.

A solemnity is the highest-ranking feast days in the Roman Catholic Church. Other solemnities include Sundays during the season of Lent, Easter, and Advent, and every day of Holy Week leading up to Easter.

In Roman Catholicism, Mary is referred to as the *Queen of Peace*, since the Messiah is referred to as the *Prince of Peace* (Isaiah 9:6). The Solemnity of Mary is also World Day of Prayer for Peace in the Catholic Church.
