
Finbar's Newsletter November 2024

MATHS AT HOME

It can be particularly difficult to know how to support your child with maths at home but you can help develop their maths skills by involving them in everyday activities. Your child can help measure the ingredients when baking or work out which supermarket deal is the cheapest. Take a close look around your home or our on the street and you will quickly come to notice that numbers are everywhere! It all helps them understand maths in real life.

As part of the maths curriculum, children use TTRockstars (Year 3 – Year 6) and Numbots (Year 1 & 2). Your child can access these site at home and we would encourage them to do this on a regular basis.

READING AT HOME

At St Finbar's we strive to build a reading for pleasure culture amongst our children.

Question: How can you help your child become a great reader?

Answer: By reading at home. Children who have high levels of literacy and achieve the best reading score read at home and read for pleasure. At St Finbar's we give your children the tools to be successful readers. For children to be the best readers we need your help in ensuring children read at home too.



Ways to help your child with reading:

- Help your child to make reading a daily habit.
- Talk about new vocabulary with your child so they understand the meaning of new words and phrases.
- Ask questions about what your child is reading.
- Ask them to explain what is happening in the story.
- Make sure your child has a balanced reading diet: are they often reading similar books? Can you guide them to trying new styles and genres?



- Please sign your child's reading card.


THE GOLDEN BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE


This is something we will make available all year and continue to celebrate.



AUTHOR VISITS'


On 26th September the author, Zoe Antoniades visited school and shared her series of texts with the school. We thoroughly enjoyed listening to different sections of each text and asked some great questions.











Year 4 & 5 went to visit Matthew Arnold Primary School to take part in their author visit. They met the author, Justyn Edwards, and had a chance to see him complete some amazing magic tricks!

They heard extracts from his book 'The Great Fox Illusion' and were able to ask him questions about being an author and how he came up with ideas for his stories.







Key Stage 2 met the author, Rab Ferguson on Monday 14th October. Rab is the author of the award-winning 'The Late Crew', a series around young carers meeting aliens!

Rab helped the children make up aliens on his visit and also read out extracts from his books. Children had a brilliant time.


