

ADVENT

Advent is a liturgical season consisting of four Sundays leading up to Christmas and ending on Christmas Eve. It is celebrated by Christians all over the world. It is an Old English word coming from the Latin *adventus* (arrival) or *advenire* (to come). It is a special time dedicated to the remembrance of Jesus' coming as a baby over 2,000 years ago.

When does Advent Start? Advent starts on the nearest Sunday to 30th November and lasts until midnight on Christmas Eve.

What happens during Advent? Christians across the world prepare to celebrate the arrival of the Lord into the work through the birth of His son Jesus Christ. Advent is a time to celebrate light in the midst of darkness.

What is the Advent Wreath? The Advent Wreath is an evergreen wreath with 4 candles (3 purple and 1 rose). The candles are lit every night during Advent, 1 candle the first week, then an additional candle for each successive week.

What do the coloured candles represent? Three of the candles are purple because the colour is a liturgical colour that signifies a time of prayer, penance and sacrifice. The rose candle symbolises joy.

The first candle, which is purple, symbolises, hope. It is also called the 'prophecy candle'.

The second candle is also purple and represents faith. It is called the 'Bethlehem Candle'.

The third candle is pink and is called the 'Shephard's Candle'.

On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Saviour. The candle is called the 'Christ Candle'.


KS1 children also took part in a virtual dental hygiene session and learnt about the impact of sugar on their health.
