


ST FINBAR'S FEAST DAY

LIVERPOOL CITY COUNCIL NEIGHBOURHOOD MODEL

We have been notified by Liverpool City Council that Grace Perry is the Neighbourhood Manager for Area 7, covering Dingle, Festival Gardens, Princes Park, Sefton Park, St Michaels and Toxteth wards.

The Neighbourhood Model is part of the wider transformation programme in Liverpool City Council (LCC) and works on a geographical footprint of 13 neighbourhoods across the city (including the city centre) with populations of between 30-50,000, reflecting the new ward boundaries. A copy of the map is below, for your information.

Each neighbourhood will work on the basis of a 'team around a neighbourhood' made up of existing staff in existing roles both within LCC and with their partners.

The neighbourhood manager role is intended to:

- Bring people, partners and data/intelligence together for a better understanding of each neighbourhood
- Identify key issues and lead preventative work on a neighbourhood level.
- Understand key projects and wider strategies and plans.
- Connect various service areas within the Council.
- Facilitate regular meeting with various teams and task forces.
