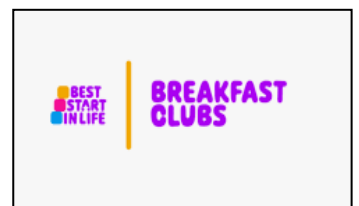
Over the last few weeks of preparation the children have shown real enthusiasm and interest as they move towards this very special occasion.

## YEAR 1 STAY & LEARN



On Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> May, our Year 1 classroom welcomed the parents/carers to our special 'Stay & Learn' session. It was lovely to see our parents/carers working alongside their children, gaining a first-hand look at the Year 1 learning environment.

Families explored our continuous provision, seeing how purposeful play-based tasks are carefully designed to support independent learning and development.

Key highlights included:

**Fine Motor Magic:** Families joined in activities aimed at strengthening little hands – crucial for building stamina in writing.

**Posture and Focus:** We discussed the vital link between sitting correctly and improved concentration, showing how good posture can have a lasting positive impact on a child's learning.

**Reading and Oracy:** We shared thoughts on the importance of talking and reading at home, which remain the foundation for everything we do in class and the importance of back and forth conversations to further develop oracy skills.

**Looking Ahead:** As we approach the final term, we also began discussions on preparing our children for the exciting move into Year 2.

## SAINT DAYS

There are several saints' days in June, just two are mentioned below:

### Saint John the Baptist's Feast Day is 24<sup>th</sup> June

He is the Patron Saint of Baptisms.

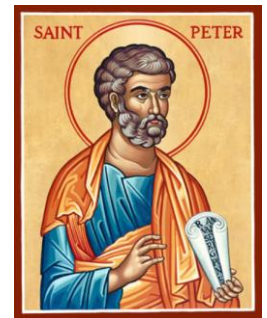
John the Baptist was the first disciple of Jesus Christ. John was born of elderly parents, St. Elizabeth and St. Zachariah. They were good, patient, law-abiding people, who had given up hope of ever having a child of their own until the angel's revelation to Zachariah announced to him that they were to have a son who would be called John (meaning "God is gracious"). This child of theirs was to be the one who would "pave the way" for the Messiah. John was this chosen one who would prepare the people, urging them to repent of their sins, baptising them, and teaching them the meaning of the Scriptures, in readiness for the coming of the Saviour they had been waiting for so longingly for so many years and who was now at hand. John himself needed preparation for this important mission, and for many years before his public ministry he lived an ascetic life of strict self-discipline, solitude, abstinence and prayer.



### St Peter & Paul Feast Day is 29<sup>th</sup> June

Saint Peter, named Simon at birth, was a fisherman from Galilee. Peter and his brother Andrew were fishermen before Jesus called them to follow him.

Fishing was a common profession on the Sea of Galilee. One day as Peter and Andrew were mending their fishing nets, Jesus called out to the brothers. Jesus said, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19). Both brothers left their nets to become disciples of Jesus.



After Jesus rose from the dead, Peter was one of the first to see him alive. Peter's given name was Simon, but Jesus gave him the name "Peter". The name means "rock". Jesus entrusted Peter with a very special task. He appointed him the leader of the Church. Jesus said "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church" (Matthew 16:18). Emperor Constantine gave Christians greater freedom of religion and a great church was built over the grave of Saint Peter. Today, the Basilica of Saint Peter in the Vatican stands on the same spot.

## SUNSHINE



As we are seeing an improvement in the weather with some sunshine, please remember to send your child into school with a **water bottle** and a **sun hat**. If your child has a lunch provided by the school, they do not need an additional water bottle.

Please put sun cream (for the very warm weather) on your child before they come to school. All items should be clearly marked with your child's name.

Water bottles should be named and contain plain water only. We ask that no squash, flavoured water or other drinks are sent in.

## ASCENSION AND PENTECOST

Ascension and Pentecost occur between May and June. These feasts commemorate Jesus' ascension to heaven forty days after his resurrection, and the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Asposles ten days later.

### What is Pentecost?

Fifty days afer Easter Sunday, Christians celebrate another special feast – the feast of Pentecost.



At Pentecost we remember how Jesus, after he ascended to heaven, sent the Holy Spirit to his disciples to encourage them in their mission to share God's love and mercey with the world.

Before Pentecost, the disciples were anxious and afraid. They began to worry about how they would cope without Jesus by their side. But after God the Son and God the Father sent God and the Holy Spirit to be with them always, the disciples were transformed. Strengthened and guided by the Holy Spirit, the disciples began their mission to share the message of Jesus with everyone.



That is why, after Pentecost, the disciples became known as apostles. A disciple is someone who learns from a teacher. An aspostle is someone sent out to deliver those teachings to others.

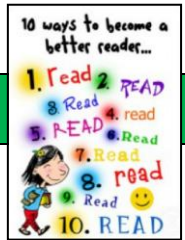
You can discover the extraordinary events of Pentecost in a book of the Bible call the 'Acts of the Apostles' written by St Luke who also wrote the Gospel of Luke.



The coming of the Holy Spirit helped Christiand understand that although there is only one God, God is revealed to us as God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.

After the Apostles received the Holy Spirit of Pentecost, they followed Jesus' instruction to "Go into the world. Go everywhere and announce the message of God's good news to everyone." Thanks to their efforts, people across the world came to know the message of Jesus and the love of God. This is how the catholic Church began to grow into a worldwide family.

## READING AT HOME



At St Finbar's we strive to build a reading-for-pleasure culture amongst our children.

**Question:** How can you help your child become a great reader?

**Answer:** By reading at home. Children who have high levels of literacy and achieve the best reading score read at home and read for pleasure. At St Finbar's we give your children the tools to be successful readers. For children to be the best readers we need your help in ensuring children read at home too.

### Ways to help your child with reading:

- Help your child to make reading **a daily habit**.
- Talk about new vocabulary with your child so they understand the meaning of new words and phrases.
- Ask questions about what your child is reading.
- Ask them to explain what is happening in the story.
- Make sure your child has a balanced reading diet: are they often reading similar books? Can you guide them to trying new styles and genres?
- Please sign your child's reading card.

## SPOTTING FAKE NEWS & IDENTIFYING RELIABLE SOURCES

### FAKE NEWS

It can be difficult to know what information online is real and what isn't. 'Fake news' is content that may look like a genuine news story but includes misleading or false information.

It is important that children understand how to identify what is fake. Talk about warning signs, such as exaggerated headlines or unusual claims.

A simple rule to share is "if something sounds too surprising or extreme, it's worth checking before believing or sharing it."



### RELIABLE SOURCES

A **reliable source** is information from somewhere trustworthy, like a news article, book, or interview, that shares accurate details about something. Organisations like *BBC News* use verified sources to make sure their reporting is accurate.

'Fake news' sites usually lack reliable sources. Any sources they do include may be made-up, exaggerated, or manipulated to fit the narrative that they are trying to push.

It is always important to check that reliable sources have been used.

### APP SPOTLIGHT - X

This week's platform spotlight is X.



X (formerly Twitter) is a social media platform where users can share short posts, pictures, videos and message other users. It is used by celebrities, influencers, and organisations. Because content spreads quickly, not everything shared is accurate. Children may come across misinformation or inappropriate content.

- X's minimum age is 13+, but is recommended for ages 18+.
- Make sure your child's account is set to private to limit who can contact them and interact with their posts.

## FACT-CHECKING TIPS – HOW TO VERIFY ONLINE INFORMATION

### FACT CHECKING

In today's digital world, headlines are often designed to grab attention and create strong reactions. However, not everything we read online is accurate. Trusted news sites, such as *BBC News*, use fact-checking teams to help readers identify reliable information.

You can help your child develop safe online habits by encouraging them to question what they see online and think carefully before believing or sharing information.



### TOP TIPS!

Here are some top tips to spot incorrect information online:

- **If it sounds sensational, it might be fake** - Does the fact sound out of the ordinary? It's likely not correct, so always double-check it.
- **Check twice** - When you find a headline that grabs your attention, find another news site to confirm that the information is correct.
- **Look for sources** - Articles will often have sources at the bottom of the page, which is where they get their information from.
- **Look for signs of AI** - Often, AI articles will have signs, such as the overuse of the 'em dash' (–) or confusing grammar.

### APP SPOTLIGHT - NORDVPN

This week's app spotlight is NordVPN.

A VPN (Virtual Private Network) hides a user's online activity and location.

While VPNs can help adults protect their privacy and information online, children may use them to bypass parental controls, school filters, or age restrictions.



- NordVPN is intended for users aged 18+.
- NordVPN can be used on phones, tablets, laptops, and gaming devices.
- It is important to talk to children about using the internet safely and responsibly.
